ELIGIBILITY

Illinois artists, 18 years of age and older. Artists residing in Illinois or those whose permanent address is in Illinois will be considered. All artwork must be original and executed within the last two years.

JUROR

Khara Koffel is a native of Souderton, Pennsylvania, and graduated from the University of Alabama with an MFA in sculpture in 2003. Currently an assistant professor at MacMurray College in Jacksonville, Illinois, Koffel continues to actively make and exhibit her found object artwork nationally.

CASH AWARDS

Cash prizes will be awarded.

ENTRY FEE

A \$25 non-refundable entry fee is required. Please make checks payable to the Springfield Art Association.

OPENING RECEPTION

An opening reception will be held on April 25, 2009 at Edwards Place Historic Home. Cash awards will be presented at this time.

SALES

The Springfield Art Association will retain a 30% commission on work sold during the exhibition.

MEDIA & SPECIFICATIONS

All media will be considered but the work must contain materials that are reused, repurposed or found. 2-D work must be suitably framed and/or have all hardware ready for hanging. 3-D work should be ready for installation. There will be no substitutes for accepted work.

ENTRIES

Image entry will be PC compatible JPEG digital files only. Images of up to two works may be submitted. Only one detail image per each work may be included. CDs must contain the artist's name on both the actual CD and the case. JPEGs should be no larger than 300 dpi at approximately 4 by 6 inches. All digital files must be in JPEG format and must include the title of the submission. Disks will not be returned.

LIABILITY & INSURANCE

All artwork is insured while in the possession of the SAA. Artists are responsible for insurance on in-bound and out-bound shipping.

RECEIVING & REMOVAL OF ART WORK

Artwork must be delivered by hand or shipped (at the artist's expense) via private carrier, UPS, Fed Ex, or USPS. No COD shipments will be accepted. All accepted work shipped and hand delivered must be received between April 6 and April 11. Hand delivered work must arrive during office hours: Monday through Friday, 9am to 5pm. Accepted artists shipping their work must include prepaid charges for return shipping.
